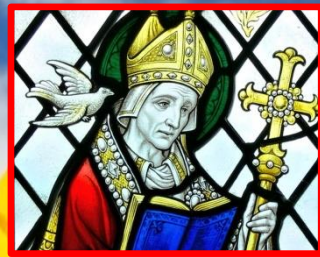


# Brent Knoll Primary School
