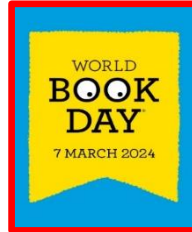
We wish all the children participating in other categories all the very best, including our own school choir and hand bell-ringers who are on stage next week.
